



INFORMATION FOR TRAVELING TO DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

April 2023, 17th -21st
Punta Cana, Dominican Republic

Documents for your travel:

- Carry your **personal passport** with at least six months before its expiry date
- Check once again if you must apply for a visa to enter the Dominican Republic at: <https://mirex.gob.do/condiciones-para-extranjeros-ingresar/>
- Visitors or non-residents of the Dominican Republic who do not need a visa will pay a fee of **USD 10.00** to enter the country during a period of 30 days, and a value of USD 20.00 upon departure (make sure with your airline if it is included in your ticket).
- Electronic form: <https://eticket.migracion.gob.do> All foreign and Dominican passengers entering or departing from the Dominican Republic on commercial flights must complete it (72 hours prior to the flight). Note: A form must be registered upon entry to the country and another on departure.
- Migration will request your return airplane ticket.
- In addition, reservations or places of lodging must be indicated or presented during the visit.
- Although the Dominican Republic has removed COVID-19 restrictions, several websites suggest carrying a full vaccination certificate.

Other important information

- Do not forget to bring sunscreen and mosquito repellent. Punta Cana is a tourist destination, and acquiring them in hotels can be quite expensive.
- The electrical energy in Punta Cana is 120 volts and the outlet used is Type A or B as in most countries in Latin America and the Caribbean.
- The official currency is the Dominican peso, although practically all sites accept payments in dollars, euros or credit card. In hotels and several places in the city you can also find Currency exchange houses.
